

Rules of the Game

Players: 2 to 5 **Age:** 6+, 9+ Time: 10 –15 minutes

Object of the Game

Score the most points by collecting the fruit cards! Find the sum of fruits from two cards that equals 10, call it and take the cards!

Winner

The player with the most cards wins the game.

- 35 Round Cards with the blue back.
- 15 Round Cards with the yellow back (for the simplified version — «Frui5»).
 - Illustrated Rules

Basic Version (7+)

Set Up

Shuffle and deal one card face down to each player. Place the rest of the deck in the centre of the table, face up, to form a drawing pile.



How to Play

At the command of the dealer, players turn over their cards and try to make the sum of 10 by matching fruits on their cards with the card at the top of the drawing pile. You will need two or more fruits from two cards which sum up to a 10.




It can be one fruit from one card and one from another, two fruits from one card and one from another, and so forth. (Note: You may not add fruits from the same card – at least one of the fruit must be from a different card.)

Fruits from both cards must be **of the same type** (i.e. two bananas, three strawberries, etc.) or **of the same colour** (two green fruits, three blue fruits, etc.) As soon as you find the sum of ten, call it and if necessary explain how you made

the sum. For example, if you make the sum of 10 by matching fruits of the same type, you must call "Strawberry 10!" or "Pear 10!". If the sum is made by matching fruits of the same colour, you must call "Green 10!" or "Red 10!"

It Can Look Like This:



The sum is made by matching two red fruit with the numbers 4 and 6. In this case, the red fruit with number 7 is not counted towards the sum of 10.

The sum of 10 can be made by matching two or more fruits of the same type.

After you find the sum of ten, you take the card from the pile and place it over your card. The pile has a new card now and all players try to find the sum of 10 again. The game continues until all the cards are played.

Additional Versions of the Game

Playing with Younger Children (6+)

Younger players who just learned numbers and are yet to learn addition can still play Frui10.



How to Play

Rather than trying to find the sum of 10 you need to find pairs of the same type or colour of fruit with the same number.

When you find the pair, call it and show the fruit and number, for example, "Purple 4!" or "Pineapple 1!".

For the basic game of Frui10, rules can be simplified. Each player is dealt two cards from the pile. You have to find the sum of 10 from your two cards. When you find the sum of 10, call it and show it to the dealer. The dealer then deals two new cards to the player.

«Three-Fifteen and Three Again» (9+)

Object of the Game

In this version of the game, the target number changes every round.

Set Up

Set Up is the same as in the Basic Version.

How to Play

Players start with the target sum of 3, then of 4, of 5, of 6 and so on until they reach 15. At this stage, the game ends and the player with the most cards wins. Alternatively, the game can continue with the target sum decreasing back to 3 (i.e., 15, 14, 13 and so forth till 3). This is why the game is called "Three – Fifteen and Three Again"! *Important*: The target sum can be achieved not only by adding, but also by subtracting numbers. For example, the target sum of 3 may be achieved by using numbers 2 and 5 (5 - 2 = 3).

«Maximum» (9+)

Object of the Game

In this version of the game, players are not looking for the sum of 10, but calling the colour or the fruit with the sum that will be the highest.

Set Up

Two top cards from the pile are placed facing up (the game can be simplified by opening only one card or made more difficult by opening three cards).

How to Play:

- Players are looking for fruits or the colour that will produce the highest sum.
- Each player tries to find the highest sum as quick as possible (each player has only one chancel)
- Each player must call it and show the greatest sum. You can say, "I pass" if you think
- the greatest sum was already called out.

 The player who calls the greatest sum correctly collects the open cards.
